This qualification applies to workers in residential facilities. These workers carry out activities related to maintaining an individual's wellbeing through personal care and/or other activities of living. Occupational titles may include but are not limited to: accommodation support worker, care team leader, care supervisor, residential care worker, support worker, day activity worker, assistant coordinator, or personal care worker. In order to undertake your practical placement and secure employment in the future you are required to obtain a current clear Victorian Police Check and Working with Children Check card. If you have any concerns please speak to our friendly staff.

A pathway for this qualification would be completing a Certificate IV in Leisure and Health or a becoming a Registered Nurse (RN) or Enrolled Nurse (EN).

## Fees and Charges
