Expected Self-Paced Study Hours

Beginner (Full Study Model) No recent related Self-paced study hours expected approximately 15 hours per week

Intermediate (Partial Study Model) – Limited knowledge and skills with related industry experience.
Self-paced study hours expected approximately 10 hours per week

Advanced (Partial Recognition Pathway) – Extensive current relevant knowledge and skills including related industry work experience
These students would be advised to attend all classes to further their knowledge and skills base, however would not be required to complete assessments where a credit transfer has been granted.

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Course Information

This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of community settings and clients' homes, who provide training and support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing. Workers promote a person-centred approach, work without direct supervision and may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team. In order to undertake a practical placement and secure employment in the future students are required to obtain a current clear Victorian Police Check and Working with Children Check card. If you have any concerns please speak to our friendly staff.

Direct pathways from this qualification is Certificate IV in Ageing Support or Certificate IV in Leisure and Health.

Fees and Charges

Training is provided with Victorian Government funding. Those seeking funded places must meet the funding criteria to be eligible. This may impact access to further government funded training. The balance may be paid on a weekly payment plan through an external company.
