Expected Self-Paced Study Hours

Beginner (Full Study Model) No recent related Self-paced study hours expected approximately 6 hours per week

Intermediate (Partial Study Model) – Limited knowledge and skills with related industry experience. Self-paced study hours expected approximately 4-6 hours per week

Advanced (Partial Recognition Pathway) – Extensive current relevant knowledge and skills including related industry work experience 4-5 hours per week
